SUPERVISOR'S REPORT:

A. NATHAN Bell of AES: Oil/Water Separator Presentation

They completed the report of contaminated soils discovered at the Town Garage. They did soil testing, and were instructed to remove the tanks. Excavated soils were hauled away. The DEC was satisfied with what has been done. The floor drains have been capped. The DEC will be looking for a plan to take care of the contaminated soils.

Recommendations:

- 1. Install holding tank to catch waste.
- 2. Drains in maintenance area will be taken out.
- 3. Trench drains can be taken care of by holding tank. It would cost from \$2.00 to \$5.00 a gal. to haul waste away.
- 4. The second option oil/water separator pump system/ sand and carbon filter to surface.

Looked into how the Town could get a permit to do haul waste away themselves. The closest plant is in Glens Falls. There would be a \$500 annual fee to haul the waste. The Town would be able to use the same truck for septic and oil.

Next step is to come up with a plan and give to the DEC.
